On Wednesday 16 January, our intermediate team competed in the first round of the Rotary Youth Speaks competition, held at John Hanson School. We were represented by George (Chairperson), Phoebe (Main Speaker) and Millie (Proposer of the Vote of Thanks), all Year 9 pupils.

School News – Pupil Success

Since our last issue of Rook News, a number of our pupils have been busy outside of school and we wanted to share their achievements with you.

William and Oliver in Years 9 and 5 are both choristers at Romsey Abbey. In December a CD, which they recorded earlier in the year, entitled 'Victoriana!' celebrating 150 years of the Romsey Abbey Choir was released and then just before Christmas they featured in a BBC 2 documentary drama – Victoria & Albert: The Royal Wedding. In the programme, renowned historian Lucy Worsley restaged the wedding of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert in stunning detail. William and Oliver can be seen singing at 'the wedding' (pictured below) which they filmed during a very long and full on day in July. If you are quick you can still catch the show on BBC iPlayer but it is only available until Monday morning.

At the beginning of the month, Ellie in Year 7 won the U13 Girls Shot Putt at the Welsh Junior Open and South West Indoor Championships. Not only did she achieve a personal best of 8.96m but beat the second placed competitor by over a metre! What a brilliant effort – well done Ellie.

In the pool, Joshua in Year 10 took Gold and the title of County Champion for the second year a row in the 50-metre backstroke. He also achieved Silver in the 100-metre butterfly and Bronze in the 100-metre individual medley, achieving personal bests in both. Competing in her first County event, Lauren in Year 6 also achieved personal bests in four of the six races she took part in. As a result of her performances, Lauren has now entered the top 10 in the Wiltshire County rankings. Congratulations to both Joshua and Lauren on their achievements especially as we know how hard you train.

And finally, Sam in Year 11 was recently appointed Captain of the Hampshire County U16s Rugby 1st XV. We are also delighted that Sam has been selected to join the U18 London Irish Squad. This is such an honour that he thoroughly deserves! At 16 we are so proud that the coaches have seen Sam's potential. What an inspiring sports captain we have.



School News – Introducing Miss Kelley



We were delighted to welcome Miss Chloe Kelley as our new Year 1 teacher in January. Here she tells us a bit about herself and why she became a teacher.

Could you tell us a little bit about yourself and career background?

I studied Primary Education at Winchester University where I gained hands-on experience in several local schools. I have worked across Year 1 and Year 2 and have found teaching both of these Key Stage One groups to be incredibly rewarding and inspiring. I really enjoy being at the start of a child's educational journey and being one of the first teachers to instil a love of learning in them. In my classroom I always encourage pupils to want to push harder with their learning, question further and challenge themselves more. These are important attributes that I hope will remain with them throughout their education.

What are you passionate about?

A personal hobby of mine has always been Art. It is something I have included in my personal learning during school, college, university and in my teaching career. I specialised in Art during my degree which allowed me to work on numerous projects with children of all ages. In a previous school I was 'art lead' and thoroughly enjoyed inspiring new artistic minds and celebrating creativity. It also gave me a real opportunity to share my passion for the subject. Passion is infectious and I hope that by displaying my passion for art it will inspire my class to identify a subject which they are passionate about too.

What inspired you to become a teacher?

When I was younger I initially found school to be quite a daunting place. However, I was lucky enough to be taught by several teachers who recognised this. Through their words of encouragement I found school to be less daunting and more engaging. I started to look forward to learning rather than being worried about what I might not understand. Without the support of those teachers and their belief in me I have no doubt that I would not be where I am today. As I have grown older, I have realised just how important your first teachers are in helping you grow as a person and how they shape not only your early years learning but also the rest of your learning journey. That is one of the reasons I wanted to become a teacher myself.

What is the best part of your job?

The best part of my job is getting to work with so many creative minds every single day. It's a privilege to have a job where no two days are the same. I really enjoy watching children learn about and experience new things and my job allows me to support them to do that. I love coming up with different ways to teach new subjects and getting children excited about new learning. I am really looking forward to the term ahead with Class 1 and watching them grow in knowledge and confidence as they experience new things and begin to discover what they are really capable of.

New online learning platform

On Monday 28th January students from Years 9, 10 and 11 were introduced to CENTURY, an innovative online learning platform.

The system responds to each student's own knowledge, skills and understanding and provides every student with a unique learning journey. By giving students and teachers real-time feedback, CENTURY allows them to focus their efforts on the areas requiring most attention. It has been proven to raise attainment by an average of 30%. Currently, CENTURY covers English, Maths and Science for KS2 through to KS4, and, over the next few weeks, we will roll the system out to other year groups. Within the next academic year, CENTURY expects to add resources for other subjects, including MFL and Humanities.

At Rookwood, we will use CENTURY in three main ways: as a classroom resource, for homework and as a revision tool. We are excited by the opportunities this new technology will bring to our students' learning. In December pupils from Years 10 and 11 took part in a French Immersion trip to Nice. It was an academic challenge with an authentic family hosting experience.


The trip was very well structured and organised and included both cultural visits to Monaco and perfumeries as well as the language challenges of staying with host families and having French lessons in the mornings.

National Finalists

Over The 2018/19 British Shooting Schools Pistol Championships (BSSPC) reached its climax this month with the national final taking place at Stoke Mandeville Stadium, Buckinghamshire, and we were delighted to have had three pupils competing.

Over this year's BSSPC season, 608 athletes representing 315 schools competed in seven regional events across England, Scotland and Wales with the best air pistol shooters going forward to the final. The Rookwood Senior Team comprising Agnes, Constance and Alex qualified after competing at the South East Championships.

The format at the final was slightly different from previous competitions as competitors used laser targets and equipment which allowed them to view a screen at their firing point to see how they were getting on. After a warm up shoot each individual had 20 competition shots to take in their own time within a 20 minute time period.

Prince William Award Update

Over the past few months Rookwood has been taking part in the Prince William Award, a fantastic scheme which enables individuals to develop their character by focusing on different skills.

Each week the children in Years 2, 3 and 4 have been set tasks which have tested their teamwork, cooperation, listening and resilience. They have also looked at problem-solving and have worked in groups as well as teams. Through this they are now beginning to recognise skills that they didn't know they possessed which is really rewarding to see.
