On Monday 9 November, 12 pupils from our Lower and Senior Schools competed in the Independent Schools Association London West Regional Swimming Gala at The Aldershot Garrison Pool.

Our junior team – Lauren, Grace, Abi, Lucy and Amelie were ready for their warm-up at 8 am. The girl's unbridled enthusiasm was reflected in the team's achievements. Lauren, Lucy and Grace all gave their best swims but were just pipped at the finish for medals. Abi gained two personal best times and Amelie received a gold and a silver medal for her determined performances. She will now compete in the National Swimming Finals in December at the London Aquatic Centre in the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.

The senior team – Joshua, Alex, Harrison, Xen, Emma, Lily and Ellie, swam in the afternoon session. Lily and Xen gained personal best times resulting in Xen winning a bronze medal. Emma and Ellie gave gutsy performances in their events too. Joshua achieved two gold medals for his outstanding swims and will be competing in the National Swimming Finals next month alongside Amelie.

The senior boys relay team were amazing. Despite having to make personnel changes at the last minute, they did themselves proud. Although just beaten to the medal positions on the Freestyle relay, the individual performances from each swimmer in the Medley relay showed determination and perseverance resulting in 3rd place and a bronze medal. It was an incredible day full of adrenaline and excitement.

The children have used their creations to put on little shows in the puppet theatre which was a pleasure to watch. Mrs Walsh has been really impressed with all the children's imagination and creativity!






## Year One
